

Battle of Richmond Re-enactment

We, the Battle of Richmond Association, are hosting an event based on the Battle of Richmond, KY, fought in August 1862. Below are a few guidelines we ask that you follow.

1. We expect your impression to be as period accurate as possible. Please do not bring flags, weapons or other items that were not invented by 1862.
2. All weapons may only be discharged in the battlefield area. No weapon may be discharged in camp for any purpose, including cleaning. ***Safety first always.***
3. **No one under 16** years of age may carry a weapon during the battle scenarios. All minors must have permission from parent or guardian to participate in this event. **Even with a parent's permission, a child under 16 may NOT carry a gun during the battle.**
4. Campfires should be out and inspected by the company's officers to see that the fire is completely extinguished. Campfires ***MUST*** be ringed with ***No*** digging. If extreme dry conditions exist, please keep campfires to a minimum.
5. ***No alcoholic beverages*** are allowed in any form on county property. Absolutely no illicit drug use of any form will be allowed or tolerated.
6. Abusive, obscene or vulgar language will not be tolerated in any form at any time.
7. All horses and other livestock must have proper health papers including Coggins. No Stallions allowed.
8. Please do not take horses on the golf course.
9. ALL vehicles must be out of camp from 8 AM Saturday through 4 PM Sunday. Parking is in designated areas only.
10. Camps should be as close to military specifications as possible. Camping will be in designated areas only. Please keep all modern conveniences (coolers, etc.) well out of sight. Please place all trash in provided bins.
11. Please do not drive on the walking trails. No campfires on walking trails.
12. Any road that has been closed will remain so. Any person removing a barricade for any reason other than an emergency could be asked to leave the event.
13. Anyone intentionally damaging the park, structures, walking paths, interpretive signs, etc. will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.
14. No dogs allowed, per county ordinance.
15. No swimming or fishing in any pond on park property.
